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

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


















MESSAGE FROM OUR DIRECTOR

LIBRARY GROWTH

Throughout the past year, McKee Library experienced a sustained and impressive expansion in its utilization of digital resources, mirroring the evolving trends in information access and consumption. Additionally, the demand for appointments related to research support and tutoring witnessed a notable upsurge, underlining our library's vital role in facilitating academic excellence and comprehensive learning support for our valued patrons.

Electronic Resources Usage Increased

The utilization of electronic resources increased this year, which is reflective of the ongoing trend of preference for electronic materials as opposed to physical resources.

Rise in Research Coaching Sessions

Research coaching session increased during the fiscal year, a trend the library faculty hope to continue in future years. This increase may be due to students becoming better acquainted with new librarians and due to concerted efforts during library instruction to promote this service.


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Information Literacy Instruction Growth

The number of information literacy events has increased from the previous year due to efforts to connect faculty to information literacy presentations via frequent email promotions as well as connections built with new and long-term faculty members. Moreover, the introduction of library tours for Southern Connections classes have added events to connect with new students, thus necessitating the change in the category title from information literacy "classes" to "events."

Library Usage & Statistics

Comparison of statistics from the last three fiscal years.



Last year, the library saw the following usage:

- 71 Information literacy sessions conducted.
- 1,681 Interlibrary loan transactions completed.
- 1,753 Individual periodical subscription usage not in electronic database.
- 11,792 Number of items checked out, renewed, and used within the library.
- 4.25 days Average turnaround time for rush book request orders.



260K Patrons visited McKee Library a total of 259,572 times during the fiscal year.



KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE


SOUTHERN ADVENTIST UNIVERSITY'S INSTITUTIONAL REPOSITORY

The university's institutional repository is a digital haven, preserving and disseminating the collective knowledge generated within our academic community. It serves as a vital platform for sharing research papers, scholarly articles, creative works, and valuable insights from our faculty, students, and researchers.

Last fiscal year, the repository had 334,243 downloads and 52,161 page visits from 10,358 institutions from 218 countries. The map above shows the overall readership from across the globe.

PEER TUTORING

The Writing Center and Tutoring Center tutors served students across the disciplines with writing and course support.

Appointment usage for both areas increased over the previous year, though the Writing Center has not returned to pre-COVID numbers. With the creation of the new specified space for the Writing Center and the Tutoring Center on the remodeled third floor, the library hopes to see a more marked increase in tutoring sessions.

Writing Center Appointments

Writing Center tutors conducted 1,808 appointments last fiscal year, an increase from the previous year.

Tutoring Center Appointments

The Tutoring Center held 6,896 tutoring appointments during the fiscal year, representing a ratio of 2.68:1.

Workshops & Instruction Sessions

Dr. Sonja Fordham conducted 20 instruction sessions across various departments.
