Library instruction team works to expand virtual library services for the 2015-2016 academic year

In order to meet the research and information literacy needs of our students, the library instruction team has reorganized course Research Guides and created several virtual tutorials.

Course Research Guides

Over the summer, all course Research Guides were reorganized in order to best serve student researchers. A Research Guide is available for every

academic discipline on campus and a course specific guide can be created upon request.

RefWorks

RefWorks is the library-supported bibliographic management tool used on campus. In order to help students learn how to correctly utilize this amazing resource, the instruction team has created a self-guided tutorial with built-in assessment.

While we are encouraging the use of this tutorial in all English 102 courses, it is available campus-wide for students. The tutorial is appropriate for undergraduate and graduate students.

Evaluating Academic Sources

A self-guided tutorial is available to discuss the hierarchy of evidence and the differences among primary, secondary, and

tertiary sources.

Suggested Databases

SPORTDiscus

SPORTDiscus with Full Text is a comprehensive source of full text for sports & sports medicine journals, providing full text for 550 journals.

PsycARTICLES

The database contains more than 150,000 articles from 70 journals. It includes all journal articles, book reviews, letters to the editor, and errata from each journal. Nearly all APA journals go back to Volume 1, Issue 1.

FOCUS ON WRITING

Five alternative writing assignments from *Engaging Ideas* by John C. Bean

1. A religious studies professor asks students to write a dialogue between a believer (in God) and an unbeliever, in which the main issues that have [been] raised in class are debated.

2. A literature teacher has students rewrite the ending to a short story or to retell a story from the perspective of a different narrator; a history teacher asks students to rewrite

a historical narrative from a different point of view.

3. A mathematics teacher has students write their own story problems relating mathematical concepts to real-world concerns. Writing word problems demands clear, specific, and complete instructions, which requires good understanding of the mathematical concept underlying the problem.

4. A history and sociology teacher asks students to do an ethnographic paper on another culture.

5. A sociologist teaching an environment course asks students to write personal narrative essays about their encounters with the natural world. The course juxtaposes study of academic articles about nature and personal essays about nature.
