#### Introduction

- Generally, Black Americans report a greater mistrust of police than White Americans do (Reinka, 2017).
- Teenage and college students hold less positive attitudes towards police than older citizens do (Girgenti-Malone, 2017).

# Students' Views on Police

# **Hypothesis**

- Hypothesis 1: There will be a difference in views on police as a function of gender.
- Hypothesis 2: There will be a difference in views on police as a function of ethnicity.
- Hypothesis 3: There will be a difference in views on police as a function of class standing.

#### Results


- An independent samples T-test was conducted to analyze the effect that gender had on views on police.
- One-way ANOVAs were conducted to compare the effects that ethnicity and class standing had on views on police.
- There was no significant difference in views on police as a result of all three variables.


#### **Methods**


- Participants were 38 students (17 male,21 female)
- Participants responded to a questionnaire consisting of a demographic survey and the Attitudes Towards Police Legitimacy Scale (APLS).

#### Discussion

- The results that gender, ethnicity and class standing did not have an impact on views on police could be beneficial to researchers studying college students.
- The small sample size could play a part in the lack of variance.
- Larger sample size could affect result.







### **Points of Interest**

- The survey question with the highest average (higher level of agreement) was "I'm not afraid to call the police when I need to" with a 5.1 average.
- The survey question with the lowest average (lower level of agreement) was "Law enforcement agencies hire the best people available" with a 3.2 average.
