SOUTHERN CELEBRATES 1892 - 1992

Seventh-Day Adventists Centennial

Southern College, one of eleven colleges and two universities in the North American Adventist school system of higher education, had its beginnings a century ago. George W. Colcord founded the school in 1892 at Graysville, Tennessee, about 30 air miles north of its present location.

The school moved south to the opposite side of the Tennessee River Valley in October of 1916. A caravan of laden wagons arrived at the new site, the former Thatcher farm, by way of the Great Indian War Trail which cut across While Oak Mountain. Between that western ridge and Bauxite Ridge to the east, tribal Indians once met for councils. Civil War raiders roamed the valley and hills where now sits a beautiful thousand-acre campus with upwards of 1400 students and a student/faculty ratio of 11:1.

Nearly seventy percent of the students come from the eight southeastern states. Most of the other states and more than two dozen foreign countries are also represented. An extension campus at Florida Hospital Medical Center in Orlando offers the complete nursing curriculum.

A four-year co-educational institution, Southern College offers liberal arts, professional and pre-professional, and vocational studies. It cooperates with Loma Linda University in offering the master of science degree in education and the master of public health degree. It also cooperates with Andrews University in offering the master of science degree in nursing. Its Christian setting encourages an awareness of man's relationship to God and a commitment of service to mankind. Southern College welcomes students of any race or religion whose principles and interests are in harmony with its objectives and conservative values.
