CAMPUS RESEARCH DAY

Deadline for Proposals is Friday, February 28, 2020

Campus Research Day is April 16, 2020. We are looking for submissions from the 2019-2020 academic year. Proposals are due by Friday, February 28, 2020.

Although there is a competition component to Campus Research Day, faculty are encouraged to recommend student participation in presenting their works, either through oral presentation or poster. Competition Participants
