She got the shoe project idea from Mike Milanzi, an African who is studying at the University of Alaska. He said to take second hand shoes, because they are very expensive and most young men headed for school just can't afford them. This shoe project is just a small part of the 10,000 pounds of goods she has collected and packed for African families,

We wish the best for them in their important work and look forward to hearing more about it. Their address is Dr. Edwin Kraft and Avalon Bachelle-Kraft, Malamulo Hospital, P. O. Makwasa, Malawi Africa.

Recently six students--Stephen Bralley, Robin Criddle, Loretta Curtis, Rochelle Freeman, Steven Kurti and Trausty Shepherd--along with Veronica Faz, one of our staff members, went on a Mission Trip. There were a total of 7 adults and 21 students representing Laurelbrook. Fletcher, Harbert Hills and Advent Youth Ranch as well as LCA. The project was at Bethel Institute which is located 40 miles north of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic. Bethel is a training school for self-supporting Bible workers. At the present there are 5 young men and 2 young ladies--ages 17-24--who are students there. While there the group did finishing work on the chapel and built additions on to two homes. Water lines were installed to the homes. The students had opportunities to visit nearby villages to give Bible studies and pass out clothing. They also visited the Country Life Restaurant in Santo Domingo and passed out literature on the streets. The students were most impressed by the eagerness of people for spiritual food. Our group had a wonderful time and would have been happy to stay right there and continue what they were doing.
