Dear Creekers,

We are very sorry about the delay in getting this letter out to you. Seems like there is just not enough time to go around. Right now we are in the middle of freezing corn and peaches. Green beans were finished up just before the corn came in. Believe me, there is an abundant crop of corn, so much that we have had to go out and sell it.

Some of you who were here in the early days will remember Faye Hand and all that she did to help us. She has been in declining health for some time and passed to her rest on June 22, 1991. Faye has one half-brother in Iowa that she seldom saw so we have been her family most of her life. Barbara (Collins) Pletcher '59 came down from Michigan for the funeral, she had been down to see Faye last fall. Faye certainly dedicated her early life to helping us realize our dream of a school and sanitarium. She will be missed.

Our bus with Bill Foster and Del Dimick as drivers has taken a group of young people to LaVida Mission to help in a project there. They will go on to Denver to attend the A.S.I. meeting the 1st of August. Three young people from Little Creek were among the group.

On May 26, 13 young people joined the Alumni Association--Kurt Amos, Jonathan Bentjen, Darron Boyd, Michelle Courtney, Lisa Dick, Erin Figge, Mike Forbeck, Keli France, Brent Goodge, Tim McClain, April Pillsbury, Kim Remington, Angela Vogt. April, 1991 Dear Creekers,

Most of you probably read about it in the Review, but was better hearing the details in person. We will try and give you a short version of this talk with all of us here that Friday evening.

They were about seven hours late as their plane could not leave Orlando because of high winds. I had surely wasted my time wondering if the weather would be good here! Noticed a report of a talk by Dr. Kent Van Arsdell '79 given at a Lifestyle and Medicine Seminar at Wildwood, GA in November.

Mr. and Mrs. Dan Peek '84 have been in Peru for six months so we really were surprised when Dan came to see us recently. He had been sent to the States to purchase things for the college. Elder James Micheff, a pastor from Michigan, and the father of three of our staff members, has agreed to assume the position of President-Pastor. He has a special interest in the outreach program that we have found difficult to sustain.

Rogene Goodge and Ken Micheff have been put in charge of the school program. This has freed Kenneth to be business manager to handle the ever more complicated legal and financial problems. Leonard Smith is still the treasurer, Ann Goodge is the Administrator of the Sanitarium. We hope this additional help will make the burden more bearable all around. The current outreach program began with a weekend workshop by Elder Leon Cornforth. The students have responded well and are going out every week in the community with books to give away and receiving donations. This week the sophomore and juniors also went to help build a kids' park for underprivileged children in Knoxville.

Recently, in a 2 day blitz the church-auditorium has been given a new roof. Involved was installing 1 1/2 inches of insulation to facilitate heating and cooling. Ceiling fans have also been installed.
