Dear Alumni,


The purpose of our newsletter is to keep you informed of what is happening at Little Creek, and to help you keep in touch with the school and your former classmates. We have tried to avoid using the newsletter as a fund raising tool. However, from time to time some of you do ask what our needs are.

Our greatest area of need at present is for additional and improved faculty housing. Ever increasing government regulations in the Sanitarium, and other major projects such as the new boiler, often have to have first priority, which puts housing at the bottom of the list of priorities. Because they are fire hazards and general maintenance headaches, we have tried to gradually eliminate mobile homes and replace them with better quality housing. We sold a double wide trailer about two years ago, and have never replaced it with a house yet. We are currently working to finish a new house that is replacing a trailer. Any additional funds to finish this house and start another one would be a real blessing to us.

Another area where there is always a need, and where even small gifts help a lot is our worthy student fund. The monthly cost for a student, after their vocational credit, averages from \$200 to \$300 or more. Many parents struggle to keep up with this, particularly if they have two students enrolled in academy.

We appreciate the interest and support of all of you and are always glad to see any of you who are able to stop by and visit. We want to do our best in training young people to serve God and Man and to be ready to meet a soon returning Savior. Please keep us in your prayers.
