It's exciting to be here at Little Creek Academy and see how God is taking care of this place. We have enrolled eighty students, the largest group of students ever to attend Little Creek Academy. I believe we have a great staff and am looking forward to a great year.

It seems we always have needs. Once upon a time I heard a story that alumni seem to be very interested in their AlmaMater and that alumni can be very helpful. So---I have some ideas if you would care to get involved:

- a. New mattresses for the boys' dorm (the old foam pads have had it!)
- b. Computers for the computer lab. An alumni friend has already paid for one-half on a matching basis.
- c. Lockers, or some type of book storage, for hall in classroom area.

I have a personal favor to ask of each of you. Please remember Sharon and me, the students, the staff, and the future of this institution in your prayers. With the Holy Spirit here in abundance, this place will go in a big way for the Lord! Thank you for your prayers and loving support.
