CAMPUS RESEARCH DAY

March 30 is the next important event deadline

Campus Research Day 2021 will be held virtually on April 15th. The next important deadline for the event is March 30, 2021.

Oral Presentation Requirement

Oral presentation presenters must attach the full text of their research paper or a working draft (oral presentations) in KnowledgeExchange by March 30. Presentations are not considered complete until this step is finalized. This is also the final date to change your title or withdraw from the event, if necessary.

Presenters will not be assigned to a timeslot until after March 30th. After this date, names and presentation titles will be included in the electronic Campus Research Day program.

Poster Presentation Requirements

Poster presentation presenters can make changes to poster titles in KnowledgeExchange until March 30. This is also the final date to change a title or withdraw from the event, if necessary.

After March 30, names and presentation titles will be included in the electronic Campus Research Day program.

The final deadline for poster presenters is April 9, 2021. Presenters will need to submit the following by then:

1. A PDF of the digital poster in

KnowledgeExchange

2. A 5-minute video talking about the research. This video will feature the poster in the background and the presenter in a sub-screen. Directions for completing this video, which will be done on Panopto, will be sent to the presenters via email.

Presentations are not considered complete until these two steps are finalized.

Volunteers Needed

We are in need of faculty volunteers to serve as evaluators for our non-competing sessions. These sessions will take place via Zoom from 9:30 to 10:45 am. There will possibly be an afternoon session as well.

Faculty evaluators are responsible for assessing student presentations. An evaluation rubric will be provided. Moderators will be present to facilitate the Zoom session.

ATLA RELIGION DATABASE

The *ATLA Religion Database* is an essential resource for religious and theological studies, providing bibliographic records covering topics such as biblical studies, world religions, church history, and religion in social issues. Indexed journals are selected for inclusion according to their scholarly merit and scope, representing

major religions, faiths, and denominations. Full-text content is provided in more than twenty languages from nearly forty different countries.

Coverage includes more than 3 million records, indexing over 2,400 journals, 280,000 essay records, 1 million review records, and 449,000 book records.

Subject areas include Bible, archaeology and antiquities, human culture and society, world religions and religious studies, church history, missions and ecumenism, pastoral ministry, theology, philosophy, and ethics.

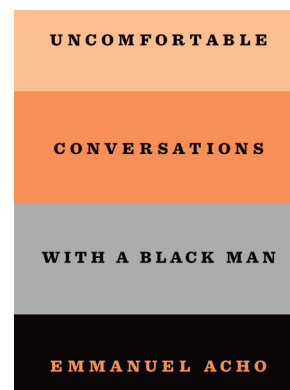
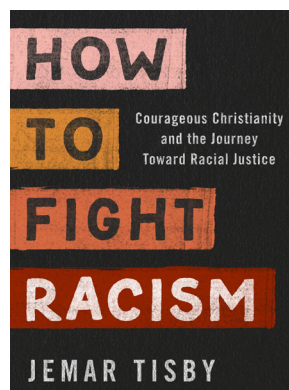
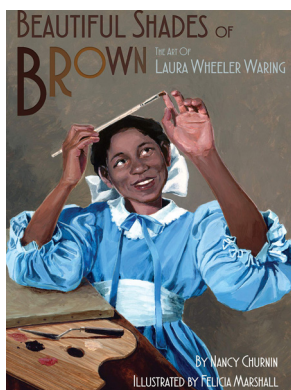
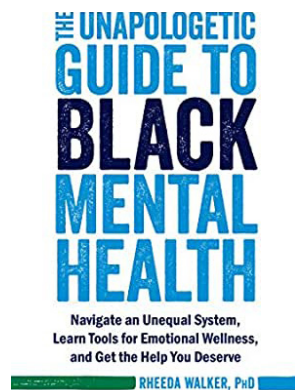
Southern Adventist University Publications Archive is a collection of university publications, historical photographs, and institutional history materials.

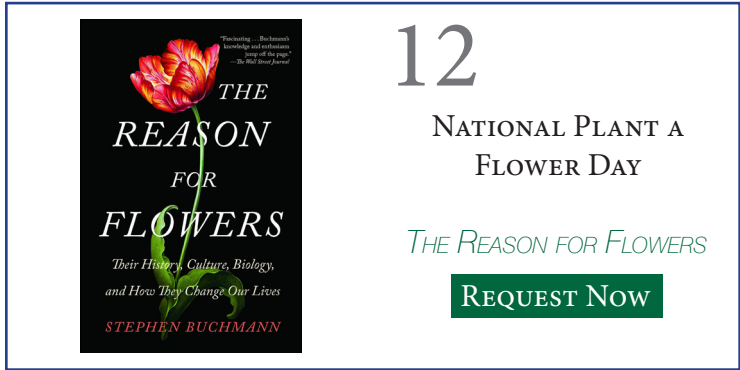

Select work from the *French Collection*

McKee Library's *French Collection* houses Charles de Saint-Évremond *Oeuvres de Monsieur de Saint-Évremond*. This work, published in 1711, is part of a larger collection compiled by a rare books expert with close ties to some prominent members of the Chattanooga community who owned extensive historical book collections.

About the Collection

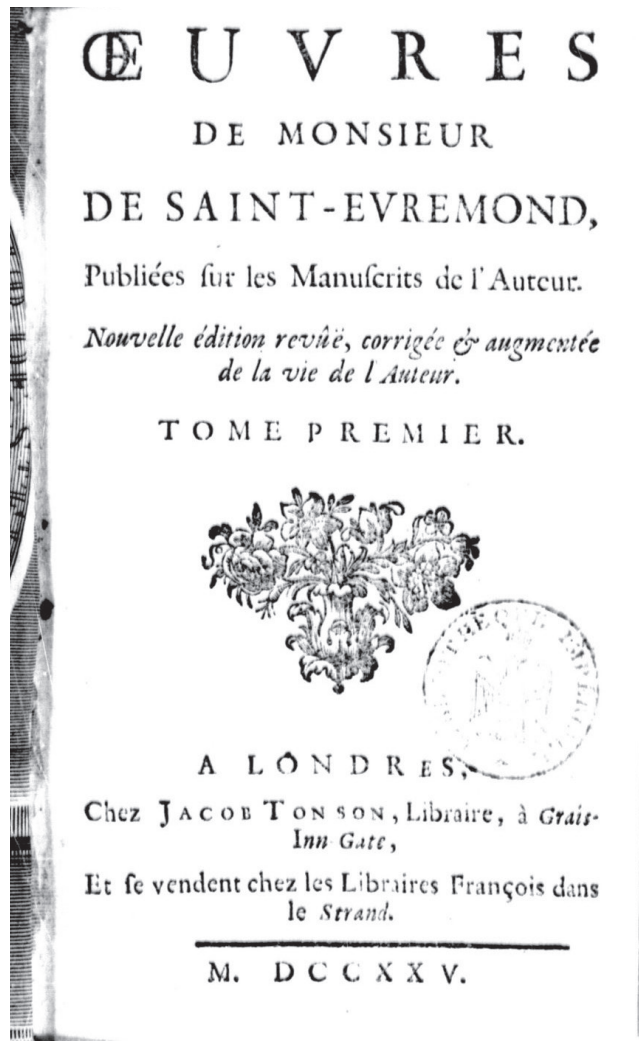
McKee Library's *French Collection* consists of 105 titles and 189 volumes of works mostly written in French. The collection spans 255 years, with its earliest book published in 1711 and the most recent in 1966. It includes works by notable authors such as Voltaire, Montesquieu, and Flaubert. Although most of the titles are written in French, a few are written in Italian, English, German, and Latin. The collection covers a variety of subjects including history, philosophy, and literary criticism and also contains

novels, memoirs, poetry, and plays.

Many of the books have been digitized and are available for online perusal using links found on McKee Library's website. The physical items may be seen for research purposes and by appointment only.
