Accessing the Reading List

To access the Office of Ministry and Missions reading list, visit the library's website and follow these steps:

1. Select Collections on the right side of the screen.
2. Next, select "Reading and Viewing Lists".
3. On the following screen, you will see the "Office of Ministry and Missions" list. This list is broken into two topics.

All items listed can be placed on hold and picked up at the circulation desk.

Select titles from the recommended titles are currently on display on the library's main floor.

Reading/Viewing Lists

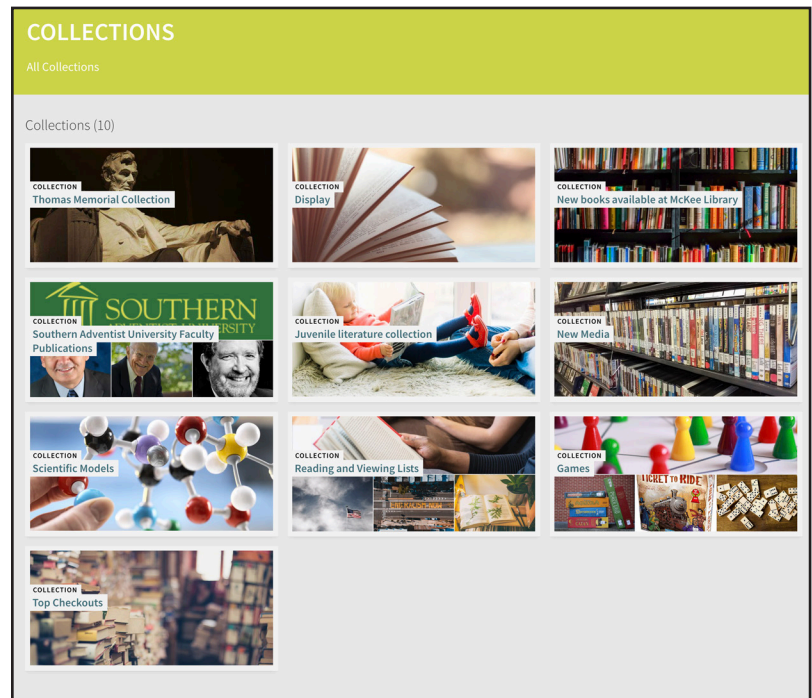
Much like the list created with the Office of Ministry and Missions, McKee Library can create a course-specific reading and viewing list for an individual class or on a topic of interest. Materials in the list can include physical and electronic books and physical and streaming media titles held in the library's collection.

While articles and online materials cannot be added to a reading list, a custom research guide might be an excellent alternative. A

research guide can include links to your reading list, but also to online content such as YouTube videos, articles, internet links, and more.

The Libby app offers access to content on your mobile device. To download

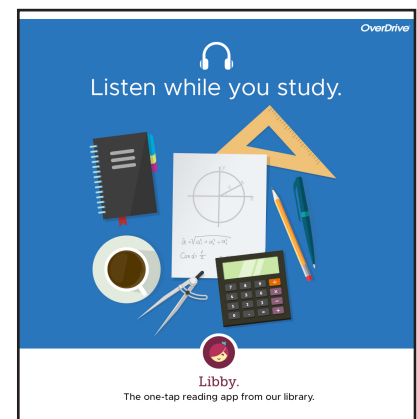
the app for free, search in your app store for "Libby".

ATOZ FOOD AMERICA & ATOZ WORLD FOOD

McKee Library is pleased to announce that it has recently added two culinary databases to its online reference offerings: *AtoZ Food America* and *AtoZ World Food*. The *AtoZ Food America* database contains more than 2,000 state, regional, and ethnic recipes—including food culture articles—as well as historical and reference

articles including an ingredients section. It is the largest food database of its kind focused solely on diverse American cuisine. *AtoZ World Food* contains more than 7,000 traditional recipes from 174 countries, along with thousands of ingredients, food culture, and reference articles, making it the largest food database of its kind. Both

databases allow users to forward recipes to friends by email and to create their own personal cookbook of favorite recipes.

CITATION AND JOURNAL SEARCH TOOLS

McKee Library offers users several methods for searching for content.

Citation Search: OneSearch

McKee Library's OneSearch system, accessed through the search box on the library's homepage, includes a citation search tool. This tool is in the header of the search system.

The citation search enables you to find a specific journal article, journal, or book by citation information.

For best results, include a title, ISSN, ISBN, DOI or PMID.

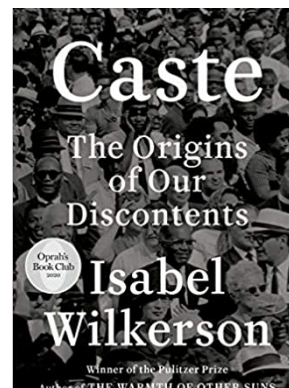
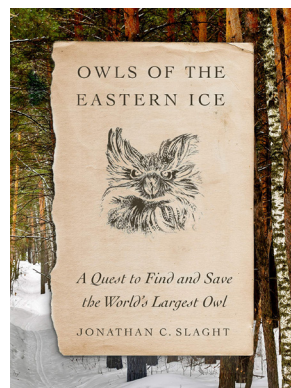
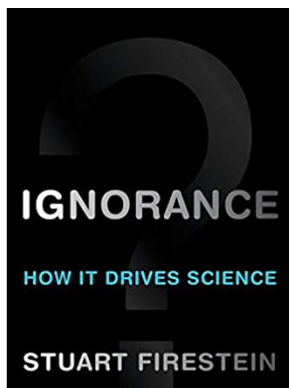
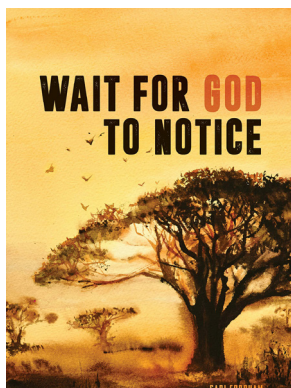
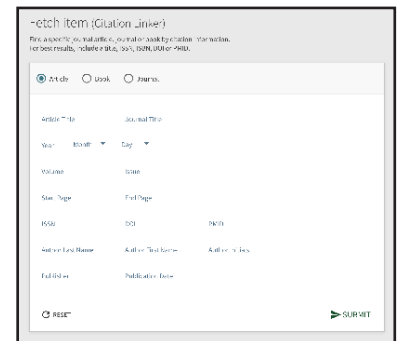
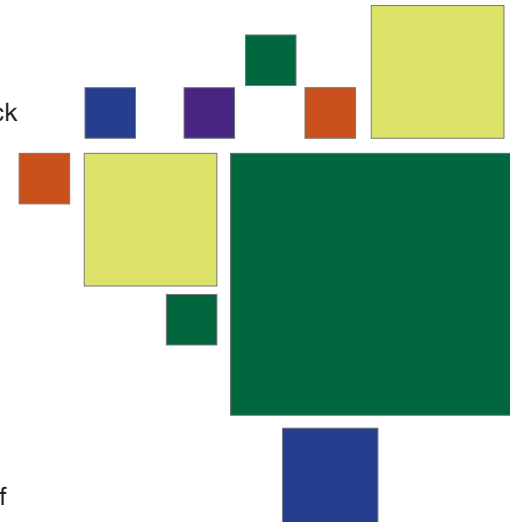
Journal Search

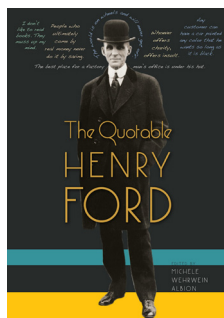

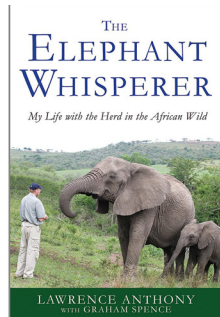

Georges Cuvier & Colonial Exploitation display at McKee Library

McKee Library's From the Vault display this semester looks at the works of Georges Cuvier and his ties to colonial exploitation.

About the Display

Jean Léopold Nicolas Frédéric Cuvier, also known as Georges Cuvier, was a French naturalist and zoologist. Cuvier was a major figure in natural sciences research in the early 19th century and was instrumental in establishing the fields of comparative anatomy and paleontology through his work in comparing living animals with fossils. Unfortunately, Cuvier's work on racial studies encouraged scientific racism and contributed to the colonial exploitation, ridicule, and commodification of black

people.

Alongside other French naturalists, Cuvier subjected Saartje Baartman, a South African Khokhoi woman exhibited in European freak shows as the "Hottentot Venus", to examinations and commissioned a nude painting of her while she was very ill. Upon her death at only 26 years old, Cuvier dissected her body, focusing on her genitalia, buttocks, and skull shape. Her pickled remains were displayed in

the Musée de l'Homme in Paris until 1970 and were only returned to South Africa in 2002.
