Dear Fellow Alumni,

I wish each of you could have been at Homecoming this year. You missed much, but it's not too early to start planning for next year! The dates for 1994 Homecoming are November 4 and 5. The honor classes will be '44, '49, '54, '64, '69, '74, '79, '84, '89, and '94. So mark your calendars for next year!

Like most schools, Little Creek has benefitted greatly from alumni support. This past year the alumni provided the students with much needed lockers in the classroom area of the Ad building. It was discussed by the alumni present at Homecoming some of the current needs of the school. We came up with three projects that we as alumni would like to support:

- Computers while the school has several computers there
 is never enough for educational purposes. And since computer knowledge is essential in this day and age, it is a
 very necessary part of education.
- Bell Choir This summer the handbells were sent off for major repairs; but there is still a need for new handbell cases and many need new hand guards.
- 3. Chairs for Cafeteria the old ones are showing their age!

As requested by alumni at Homecoming, I have talked with Mr. Garver regarding the reasons for relocating the school. While there are many reasons I will try to condense the main ones:

- Little Creek is now totally surrounded by annexed property of the city. West Knoxville is prime land for development.
- Taxes for the land have gone up 20% in the past 6 months. And, if any further rezoning is done taxes could increase as much as tenfold.
- 3. Little Creek has been provided with what is called surface water. The law states that if you use a pump it must be manned 24 hours a day. Right now the school has a temporary permit that allows the pump to operate; but if at any time they lose that permit they will have to go to city water which will cost approximately \$40,000.00 a year.
- 4. The sewer system is requiring some major work and at this time Little Creek cannot do any building until the present sewer problems are resolved.
- There has been an increase in vandalism to the property, including the total destruction of a tractor and arson.

These are just some of the problems facing Little Creek and its leaders. They need our prayers and support as they follow God's leading in the decision to relocate. If any of you would like to talk further regarding this, please feel free to call me.

May God richly bless each one of you and your families during this Holiday Season.
