

Kelvin was diagnosed with a mild mental disorder some years ago and was staying in a Christian group home in Chattanooga. He enjoyed walking and was a loner and didn't seek contact with friends or family during recent years. GORDON DALE SHIGLEY '59 passed away March 19, 1999. He was diagnosed with bladder cancer this past year. Since the day of his diagnosis his courage has been strong and without fear of death. He leaves his wife Barbara and two daughters. After taking nursing, Gordon spent a number of years in China teaching at Hong Kong Adventist College, and was instrumental in J.T. Shim '80 coming to Little Creek.

NEWS OF INTEREST

I wrote Kent and Jan an e-mail and asked them to send me a note to include in the News Letter.

KENT AND JAN (MALMEDE) GREVE '81: Jan and I came to Romania in January of 1997 to direct a project that was initiated by International Children's Care (ICC) of Vancouver, WA. Before our arrival, ICC had developed a family assistance program where material goods and supplies were distributed monthly to about 300 families. Since ICC'S specialty was in helping orphaned and abandoned children, our object was to try to develop a project where we could care for these types of children who were the most helpless in Romanian society.

Through God's providential leading, we were able to establish a small care center in Bucharest in the fall of 1997. We were able to care for up to 14 babies and children at one time. Most of the children we receive come directly from government hospitals where they had been abandoned by their parents. In Romania, life for the average person is quite difficult. A typical worker will sam from \$75.00 to \$125.00 per month and yet the prices are similar to what we pay. As a result, parents often abandon their children in the hospitals soon after they are born with the belief that they will be better care for. This leaves the hospitals filled with abandoned babies, and the Government looking for alternatives.

Last summer, through the help of two LCA alumni, we were able to purchase and renovate a large building outside of Bucharest which serves as the new care center. The official dedication took place on February 16, 1999 and was performed by Mark Finley who was in the country in preparation for the ACTS 2000 evangelistic series.

Currently we have 29 babies and children at the center. In time, the number can be increased to 40 children. Our goal is to integrate these children into loving homes, be it their natural homes or adoptive homes. We have authorization to conduct adoptions locally and internationally and are getting the necessary processes established.

Other projects are being planned at our new location, such as the possibility of a pediatric medical clinic in collaboration with Loma Linda Medical Center, and the possibility of students of Andrews University from the social work department being able to do a practicum work here at our facility. In the future we hope to develop small social homes for the children who cannot be adopted.

There is much work that can be done here, and we are grateful that God is opening these doors of service for the children in Romania.


