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
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PROBLEM - Historically, school counselors have not encouraged male high school student's interest in pursuing nursing. 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8

# Problem Background

BACKGROUND - There are approximately 118,000 public school counselors in the United States.<sup>9</sup> School counselors help students explore career options and influence decisions<sup>10</sup> but may be influenced by personal perceptions and biases. Multiple studies reported that male students experienced challenges obtaining information about nursing from school counselors.<sup>2,5,7</sup> While some studies reported school counselors had realistic perceptions of nursing,<sup>11,12</sup> other studies found school counselors rarely promoted nursing,<sup>12,13,</sup> often viewed nursing as feminine,"<sup>13,14</sup> and had a low perception of nursing.<sup>15</sup> Several studies found male students had negative experiences with school counselors and were discouraged from entering nursing.<sup>1,3,4,6,8</sup>



PURPOSE - Understand the perceptions and practices of school counselors when advising male high school students about a career in nursing.

- A mixed-methods, IRB-approved, two-phase design.
- Phase 1 Cross-sectional, descriptive, correlational survey design with two open-ended questions.
  - Instruments: demographic section, Nursing Attitudes and Perceptions School Counselor (NAP-SC), and two open-ended questions exploring current strategies used and additional resources needed.
- Phase 2 Descriptive, semi-structured interviews of individuals who completed Phase 1 and signed up for interviews.

# Summary of Findings

- Overall, school counselors have a positive perception of male nurses and support males interested in pursuing a career in nursing, which differs from previous research.<sup>1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8</sup>
- The male participants had significantly lower scores than female participants.<sup>16</sup>
- Participants from public schools were more likely to encourage males to pursue nursing.<sup>16</sup>
- School counselors with less experience had less confidence in their knowledge and availability of resources to advise male students.<sup>16</sup>
- ASCA members found it more desirable to recommend nursing to male students than non-ASCA members.<sup>16</sup>




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#### ABSTRACT


Background: The literature describes how male high school students with an interest in a career in nursing have struggled to obtain guidance, support, and accurate information.

*Purpose*: The purpose of this mixed-methods study was to understand the perceptions and practices of school counselors when advising male high school students about a nursing career.

Method: Sixty-one school counselors completed an online survey, and nine participated in online interviews between June 2022 and February 2023.

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
